This is used by big companies to keep the data stored safely and where it is easy to use when it is needed. For the rest we learned that they use data way more often

than you think.

The 2nd lesson was about AI (Artificial intelligence) and when you use AI in daily life. We found out about a lot of apps that

were made by Al. We also saw a disturbing film where it AI can recreate a person's image or voice so that people

can be tricked into sharing personal information. This is often done to trick parents into thinking that their child has a problem so they will give them money.

The 3rd lesson was about ethics. In this lesson we had an interactive powerpoint and we were asked specific questions on the ethics of digitalisation and we were able to give our own opinion linked to these ethical questions such as should

parents monitor our social media - no! We realised that there was a lot to think about when you consider about ethics.
